

## Course Overview

The subject we will study is named “International Criminal Law”. The materials in this international criminal law course cover the main points of discussion which will be studied in more detail in modules 1 to 9, as follows:

1. The scope of international criminal law consists of 3 learning activities as follows:
  - a. terms of international criminal law and functions of international criminal law,
  - b. understanding of international criminal law, the distinction between international criminal law and international criminal law, international criminal law and supranational criminal law, supranational criminal law and world criminal law,
  - c. understanding of legal principles and principles contained in international criminal law.
2. Development of international criminal law, consists of 3 learning activities as follows:
  - a. history of the development of international criminal law,
  - b. international criminal law as a new discipline in the science of law,
  - c. the binding nature of international criminal law.
3. International crime consists of 2 learning activities as follows:
  - a. scope and understanding of international crime, sources of international criminal law, transnational crimes, money laundering, transnational crimes,
  - b. terrorism as an international crime.
4. Sources and subjects of international criminal law, consisting of 2 learning activities as follows
  - a. sources of international law and international criminal law in general,
  - b. subject of international law and international criminal law.
5. The existence of hybrid tribunals in international criminal law, consists of 2 learning activities as follows
  - a. background of the formation of hybrid tribunals in international criminal law, the purpose of formation, the advantages of forming hybrid tribunals in tackling international crimes, an overview of human rights violations, the mechanism of the court to try gross violations of human rights in international courts,
  - b. hybrid tribunal court system and its implementation.

6. Criminal jurisdiction in international criminal law, consists of 2 learning activities as follows:
  - a. definition of jurisdiction and scope of jurisdiction, extraterritorial jurisdiction,
  - b. criminal jurisdiction over foreign ships in the territorial sea, extension of criminal jurisdiction on the high seas, criminal jurisdiction relating to crimes on board aircraft.
  
7. International crimes within the framework of international criminal law, consists of 2 learning activities as follows:
  - a. history and legal instruments and organizational structure of ICPO Interpol,
  - b. extradition in international criminal law.
  
8. International Criminal Court (ICC) and the Indonesian Human Rights Court in the realm of international criminal law, consists of 2 learning activities as follows:
  - a. the scope of the International Criminal Court, the basic principles for the establishment of the International Criminal Court, the working principles of the International Criminal Court,
  - b. Indonesian Court of Serious Human Rights Violations, differences in Criminal Code offenses (Extraordinary Crime) basic principles in Law No. 26 of 2000 concerning Human Rights Courts.
  
9. Command responsibility which consists of 2 learning activities as follows:
  - a. command responsibility in international criminal law,
  - b. command accountability in the Indonesian and international human rights justice system.
