Course Overview

The course of PBIS4312 /Writing II is designed to facilitate students to learn and practice writing in order to develop their ability to write different types of text as well as to be able to teach writing at junior and senior high school in accordance with the demands of today's English curriculum.

The ability to write in a variety of text types is one of the key capabilities in one of particular learning success in learning English. This course discusses the various types of texts in terms of both concept and practice. Students will be given an explanation of the concept and practice of writing various types of texts, starting with the theory and practice of planning, writing and revising, then continue with writing Discussion Text, Analytical Exposition, Hortatory Exposition, Review, Response to Literary Works, Letter, Critical Writing, Essay text writing. In addition, students will also be provided with the meaning of the concepts related to the text, the terms about the text itself, the context, and the inter-textuality. Besides, students will also be introduced with some of the criteria of the characteristics of a good text and some concepts relating to the grammar used in each kind of the text.

This course consists of 9 modules as follows:

Module 2: Writing Discussion Text

Module 3: Writing Hortatory Exposition

Module 4: Writing Analytical Exposition

Module 5: Writing Personal Response to Literary Work

Module 6: Writing Review Text

Module 7: Critical Writing

Module 8: Writing Letters

Module 9: Writing Essay Text
